Karl Marx's Tomb - The Tomb of Karl Marx stands in the Eastern cemetery of Highgate Cemetery. It commemorates the burial sites of Marx, of his wife, Jenny von Westphalen, and other members of his family.

Westminster Walking Tour of London - Westminster is London at its grandest: the place where kings and queens are crowned, where they lived, and often were buried. It's the forge of the national destiny, the place where the heart of the Empire beat, the Mecca of politicians throughout the ages. The past here is cast in stone and we take it all in: ancient Westminster Hall, the Houses of Parliament, the Jewel Tower, Westminster Abbey and more...

Westminster Abbey (Poets' Corner) - Poets' Corner is the burial site for a number of the London playwrights. Ben Jonson, Francis Beaumont, William Davenant and Michael Drayton are all buried in the Abbey, as are poets Geoffrey Chaucer and Edmund Spenser.
